MORRISON

2021 SHIRAZ CABERNET

A uniquely Australian blend of Shiraz and Cabernet Sauvignon is composed to create this wine of power and distinction. The Morrison Vineyard for which the wine is named, is situated directly across from the winery in the sub region of Leasingham. This vineyard is affectionately known as “The Golden Hillside” for the spectacular way the vineyard glistens in the morning sun.

PLACE

A combination of two vineyard parcels wine from the famed sub-region of Watervale, Clare Valley

Our grapes are grown on Ngadjuri country.

VINTAGE CONDITIONS

A dry cool autumn in 2020 lead into good winter rains. Above average spring rainfall gave way to a very cool, dry summer. These conditions slowed the grapes ripening, resulting in an abundance of flavour and excellent natural acid. Overall, conditions were reminiscent of those seen a decade ago, ideal for the variety, making it a rare vintage where quantity is generous, and quality exceptional.

WINEMAKING

The Shiraz is sourced from the Morrison vineyard and the Cabernet is grown on the opposite ridge. These parcels were vinified separately in open fermenters, before being carefully basket pressed into new and seasoned French oak barrels for 14 months.

COLOUR

Dark red with a royal purple hue

NOSE

Savoury notes of smoked charcuterie and a hint of tobacco leaf are underpinned by a soft sweet spice note.

PALATE

Intense, ripe red berry flavours flood the senses, radiating from the rich core of the palate. A slate-like minerality lends itself to a bright natural acidity that flows through the entire length of the wine. Full bodied, the wine is firmly structured while persisting with a softening tannin. The finish is carried by spiced dried fruit flavours and is rich till the very end.
